

## **LEAP SUCCESS STORY**

JoAnne was a registered nurse in Milwaukee, Wisconsin before retiring from Pain Management last year. With her four children scattered across different parts of the country, JoAnn decided to move to Charlottesville and buy a house near her son and his family. JoAnn already completed an energy assessment for her last home in Wisconsin and knew the benefits of improving a home's energy efficiency. Thus, when she bought her new house in Charlottesville, she immediately noticed areas where the builder could have been more energy efficient. After following through with the Home Energy Assessment and receiving her tailored list of recommendations, JoAnn decided to retrofit her new home in Charlottesville as well.

#### **Summery of Basic Issues Uncovered in the Assessment:**

- The fiberglass insulation on the walls was largely ineffective and the attic floor insulation was quite low. Weatherseal recommended adding an air barrier to the back side of the vaulted ceiling wall and an additional 10-12" of cellulose throughout the attic. Doing so would allow the R-19 insulation on the walls to function correctly and bring your insulation up to recommended levels.
- Air leakage was 20% below the targeted level for a house of similar volume.
- Neither of the 2 bath fans vented fully to the outside. Additionally, both are vented through flexible vinyl pipe, which can dramatically increase the air resistance in the duct.

### **Summery of Improvements Completed**

- Foam insulated the attic ceiling, the attic stair cover, and recessed lighting
- Installed foil reflective sheild into attic seperation wall.
- Installed new bath fans to improve ventilation, which were hard-piped directly to the outside through a dampered enclosure.
